Open letter to Teachers/Counselors RE: *In Jupiter's Shadow*

To Whom It May Concern:

I have worked seven years to craft and edit the story *In Jupiter's Shadow*. I started the project from a desire to share my testimony with others, something I have done verbally through my local PFLAG Speaker's Bureau and my city's Gay Alliance Youth Project.

As a gay boy growing up in a devout Catholic environment in the late '70s/early '80s, I faced a profound struggle: a strong faith and an emerging same-sex attraction. At the age of 23, I considered taking my own life, under the erroneous assumption that God would hate the "sin" of suicide less than the "sin" of a homosexual relationship.

At that time, a book saved my life. I read the memoir "The Best Little Boy in the World" by Andrew Tobias. I identified so strongly with the main character that, for the first time in my life, I realized my feelings of isolation were deceptive. The book propelled me forward on my path to self acceptance.

It's my passionate desire to reach out to the next generation with my own story, which explores the importance of emerging from the "shadow" of others' expectations, and how we sometimes work hard to keep truth from the most important person in our lives: ourselves.


If my book helps even one person feel less isolated – less condemned by society, or religion, or even themselves – I will feel very rewarded.
